EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Since 2017, Council has applied for multiple grants for the Maitland Gaol to support planning, safety, heritage and redevelopment activities with a mix of successful and unsuccessful outcomes. While these grants have supported specific works, they do not address the site's broader needs.

OFFICER'S RECOMMENDATION

THAT

1. The information contained in this report be noted as supplementary to Item no. 12.6 - Future Use of Maitland Gaol.

Since 2017, Council has submitted multiple grant applications to support planning, safety, heritage and redevelopment activities at Maitland Gaol totalling \$12.6 million. A number of these applications were successful, including

- safety and roof repairs in 2017/18,
- preparation of the Gaol Development Plan and Masterplan Business Case in 2020/21,
- Guard Tower Experience in 2021/22,
- feasibility work for hotel development in 2022/23, and
- \$10.48 million in Federal and State funding for components of the proposed redevelopment. It should be noted that this grant is at significant risk as detailed in the Council report.

Other applications have been unsuccessful, including requests relating to the Chapel, sustainability works and, most recently, hydrant and electrical compliance upgrades associated with the closure of the Gaol.

While these grants have provided support for separate elements of planning and site upgrades, they have not addressed the substantial compliance, heritage and redevelopment costs now identified for the broader Gaol site.



MAITLAND GAOL GRANT FUNDING (Cont.)

The combined funding awarded to date remains modest when compared with the total capital, compliance and operational requirements identified in the current future-use considerations. Attachment 1 provides a full list of all applications, including amounts requested, amounts awarded and project status.
